Last year we complained that we didn't have enough snow to do anything fun outside. Well this year is proving to be the opposite, and we are taking advantage of this. We are trying to have as few inside days as possible. So please send your children dressed to be outside, including when they are riding the bus. This means coat, snow pants, hat, and mitts. The buses can be cold even with the heaters on, so having your child dressed for the weather is best. We also have warm clothes available if something gets lost or forgotten.

Speaking of taking advantage of the snow, we have been conducting the Parkland Winter Games every Friday. Each student has been put into a team and chosen a country to represent. Every Friday we have had an event, including Biathlon with snowshoes and ice cubes to throw at a target, 4% of a 50km Long Distance Snow shoe race, hockey skills and bobsled on our sled hill. Dear Parents/Guardians;

We are so excited about our upcoming Troll Skiing days, which begin Thursday February 27<sup>th</sup> and continue on February 28, & March 5. On each of these days, we will be leaving the school by volunteer drivers at 8:30 am and returning to Parkland at 4:15 pm for parent pick-up. If your child does not need a ride either to or from the ski hill, please let the school know that you will be meeting us at Troll.



This notice is to remind parents and students about important things to pack and wear on these days;

- Dress in layers; a warm pull-over, jacket, gloves, ski pants, toque, scarf or neck warmer, long warm socks (and an extra dry pair), and boots
- Goggles or sunglasses if you have them
- Lots to drink and eat (children burn lots of calories when skiing), or money for concession.
- Label your child's articles of clothing, backpacks and lunch kits (students from other schools will be there too)
- Leave all valuables safely at home (if you bring money for the concession, keep it safely in a pocket or with an adult)

Parents volunteers are greatly appreciated (please ensure that you have a criminal record check on file at the school).

Reminder to Grade 6/7's to pack requirements if you are staying for the sleepover.

Students will be expected to behave in the same positive, compliant, respectful manner that is expected at school. The consequence for adverse behavior is loss of the lift ticket and arrangement for transportation home.

#### READER'S THEATRE

Present a play or a story, holding scripts which may be read from. Focus on conveying characters and plot through voice, facial expression, and minimal movements/gestures/ costumes. No more than 12 readers. Max time: 15 mins.

#### SIGHT READING (solo)

Read a selection (appropriate to your age) out loud to the audience. Selection is provided at the time of the performance. A 60-second preparation time is allowed. Not memorized!

Are you good at reading aloud? Or acting? Or writing? Memorization? Do you have a Memorization: Do you have a favourite story and like to be expressive with your voice? There's a place for you in Speech & Dramatic Arts!

#### CHORAL SPEECH

Group Choral Speaking reciting of text by a group. Prepare two selections contrasting in mood, rhythm, or feeling. No movement, props. Emphasis on language, rhythm, volume, pace, and different voices. Limited gestures O.K.

Group Dramatic Choral Speaking - same as Group Choral (above) but with movement and minimal props. Present two selections contrasting in mood, rhythm, or feeling.

More options

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#### POETRY (solo)

Novice - any form of poetry (only for the first time participant)

Lyric - a short poem expressing experience, thoughts, feelings

Narrative - tells a story and contains dialogue (can be a whole poem or a portion of a long poem)

Sonnet - a lyric poem of 14 lines (with specific rhythm scheme or pattern)

Canadian - a lyric or narrative poem by a Canadian author.

Humorous - any form of light or humorous verse

#### **GROUP POETRY**

Any type of poem (Best if some parts combined voices) Duo or group up to 8.

#### DRAMA (solo)

Traditional - a onecharacter monologue (taken from a longer published stage play written for 2 or more characters)

Shakespearean - a onecharacter monologue from a play by WilliamShakespeare





#### DRAMA (group)

Group Drama - a play or portion of a play, or the dramatization of a story, 2 - 6 actors. Max: 15 mins

Group Shakespearean - a scene for 2-6 characters from any play by Will Shakespeare, presented as if part of the whole play. Max: 15 mins

#### PROSE (solo)

The speaker is the narrator. Focus is on the voice. From a novel or short story, a selection that includes narration, description and dialogue, edited to fit time preferences and also for flow. Presented in storytelling style with minimum gestures. No acting.

#### CREATIVE WRITING

Original Poetry - an original age-appropriate poem on any topic. Max: 5 mins.

Original Prose Fiction original age-appropriate prose on any subject. Max: 5 mins.

Original Prose Non-Fiction - original age-appropriate prose on any subject. Max: 5 mins



#### STORY (solo)

Story Reading - read a story aloud (using the book). It should be well learned but not memorized. Story should have some dialogue. No acting, but good vocalization is encouraged Max: 5 mins.

Story Telling - in your own words, tell a story! Can be original or taken from a book. Make it sound spontaneous. Add detail or change the story if you wish. May use simple props and costumes. Max: 5 mins.

#### NON-COMPETITIVE CLASSES

Mime - a silent scene that includes character and situation, driven by physical communication. Chairs may be used, but no other props. (Provide a brief, typed plot outline.)

Group Mime - as above but including up to six participants.

Public Speaking original prepared speech on any topic. Memorization not required.

Improvisation - Choose your form: acting, storytelling or public speaking. The adjudicator will suggest a topic or idea. Invent and perform it. Preparation time: 1 min.
