- Canadian Monster Club The Summer Picnic- Troy Townsin



Over 40 classes K-7 will be participating in this year's battle. We thank you for supporting your child in this important learning activity.






# Battle of the Books 2025 (overview)




#### Raven's Ribbons - Tasha Spillet

Raven's Ribbons shares a moving intergenerational story that celebrates gender-expression, honouring traditions and finding room for reinvention.




#### Métis Like Me-Tasha Hilderman

This book celebrates Métis culture through the eyes of children. It is an intergenerational story that not only highlights the richness of Métis traditions but also fosters empathy and a sense of identity when one child feels disconnected from their Métis heritage. The reader learns that it is never too late to embrace and celebrate one's culture.



#### Beneath - Cori Doerrfeld

This book explores the notion that everything you see on the outside isn't necessarily what we see on the inside. Feelings and experiences can be hidden beneath the surface and it's okay to share and understand them with people you trust.



## Canadian Monster Club The Summer Picnic - Troy Townsin

This book is a fun picture book that introduces readers to Cānādā's mythological creatures through an annual July 1st picnic. It is one of a series of books.






#### More Than Words - Roz McLean
